Required Books

Bible - Your preferred English translation. The *Ryrie ESV Study Bible* is highly recommended.

Recommendation from the Academic Department:

- All first-year students are required to read through the entire Bible and write a short title for each chapter, in 10 words or less. While this assignment is not due in its entirety until the end of the school year, students are strongly encouraged to begin reading prior to their arrival on campus.
- Students are also required to read Ryrie's *Basic Theology* in its entirety for the Fall Quarter *Systematic Theology* course. It is strongly recommended that students begin reading this book prior to their arrival on campus.

If English is not your first language. . .

You might find a few of these books translated into your first language. If you do, it is acceptable to use them.

A Bible in your own language is also helpful.

Students whose first language is not English are required to bring a hard-copy dictionary to Hungary. Hard-copy dictionaries can be used during classes, exams and while doing homework. During the classes, digital dictionaries can be used only on laptops and tablets, but they cannot be used on cell phones and small electronic devices (e.g. smart phones, iPods and similar devices).
